From a site overlooking Lake Huron, plans for a new health care complex are underway. It's the culmination of a long term vision for local health care and a much needed expansion of the services that can be provided in current facilities. When completed, the new Straits Healthcare facility will combine a critical access hospital with a tribal health clinic and rural health clinic to serve the needs of Straits area residents and visitors.



The new 124,000 square-foot facility will meet our present and future healthcare needs.

- The State of Michigan has issued a Certificate of Need for the new facility

Why A New Hospital?

what's wrong with the one we've got?

The current hospital was built 1953. Medicine has changed a lot since then and so have the demands on hospital facilities. Plus, as the current building's infrastructure ages the cost of keeping it up and modifying it to meet today's requirements is more expensive than it would be to build a new one that meets current codes, current standards and provides the most efficient facility for the superb team of medical professionals at the hospital to provide quality care. The new facility will also enable health care services that the current hospital just can't offer given the space demands on the current building.

A New Hospital Is An Investment In **The Future**.

Supporting your local hospital is one of the best investments you can make in your community, for your health and well being, for that of your family and friends, and for the ongoing economic health of the area. Good local health care is critical for all those reasons and it is a catalyst for future development, especially since the nearest tertiary hospital is about 50 miles away.

How Is This New Hospital Funded?

No project like this can be built without a major cooperative effort and partnership between government and private donors. The total project cost is currently estimated at \$27.2 million. That may sound like an intimidating figure, but it is certainly achievable.

• The United States Department of Agriculture has recommended a total of \$23 million federal funding in a combination of grants and long-term loans.

- The hospital has already received a generous gift of land for the new facility which is valued at \$1.2 million.
- Foundation monies and private donations from individuals throughout the Straits area all will be needed to raise the remaining \$3 million and make the new Straits Area Healthcare Village a reality.
- Because the new facility is a critical access hospital it qualifies for 101 percent cost reimbursement for all medical procedures paid for by Medicare. This will help enable the hospital to pay off the long-term loan portion of the federal funding.

An investment in local healthcare comes back to the community many times over and is a catalyst both for the long-term economic health of the community and for future development.

My husband, Charles, has needed the hospital for a billion and one things over the past 25 years, five times in the last year alone. If it hadn't been for Mackinac Straits Hospital, we would have had to move to Petoskey. Other hospitals are bigger but this one is more friendly. I'm very pleased with their service and the one-on-one care.

Growing NeedFor Vital Health Care Delivery

The need for health care services delivered by Mackinac Straits Hospital continues to grow. In fact, the hospital performed more than 87,000 procedures in 2006. That's up from 79,000 in 2004, an increase of about 10 percent. The demand for certain types of care is up dramatically over just the last three years:

- Speech therapy has more than tripled
- 80 percent more chemotherapy administrations
- 62 percent increase in dialysis treatments
- 13 percent hike in mammography

It's clear that a new facility is required to keep pace with the region's rising need for health care services.



A New Era In Improved Healthcare


