A. INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR MACKINAC COUNTY DESIGNATED ASSESSOR

City Assessor Mulka informed Council that through a State required process, Mackinac County has selected Tina Fuller as the Designated Assessor to represent the County. The role of the Designated County Assessor will be to offer assistance to local government entities within the County, if they should be identified as non-compliant by the State Tax Commission in the Audit of Minimum Assessing Requirements (AMAR) process.

B. RESOLUTION INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR MACKINAC COUNTY DESIGNATED ASSESSOR

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR MACKINAC COUNTY DESIGNATED ASSESSOR

WHEREAS, The City of St. Ignace City Council met in regular session on November 23, 2020, and approved the Interlocal Agreement naming Tina Fuller, who is an individual qualified and certified by the State Tax Commission as an Advanced Assessing Officer, to be the County Designated Assessor for Mackinac County.

WHEREAS, This Interlocal Agreement, by and between the County of Mackinac, a political subdivision of the State of Michigan (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and Bois Blanc Township, Brevort Township, Clark Township, Garfield Township, Hendricks Township, Hudson Township, Marquette Township, Moran Township, Newton Township, Portage Township, St Ignace Township, and the City of Mackinac Island and the City of St. Ignace, each a political subdivision of the State of Michigan (each hereinafter referred to as an "Assessing District", and collectively referred to as the "Assessing Districts"), is entered into pursuant to the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, Public Act 7 of 1967 (Ex. Sess.), as amended, MCL 124.501 et seq., and the General Property Tax Act, Public Act 206 of 1893, as amended by Public Act 660 of 2018, MCL 211.10g, for the purpose of designating an individual to serve as the County's Designated Assessor.

WHEREAS, pursuant to MCL 211.10g(4), every County shall have a Designated Assessor on file with the State Tax Commission as of December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The County Designated Assessor is designated by an Interlocal Agreement executed between the County Board of Commissioners and a majority of the Assessing Districts in the County; and

WHEREAS, the individual designated as Mackinac County's Designated Assessor must be approved by the State Tax Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS GOVERNING BOARD, THAT the City of St. Ignace approves the Interlocal Agreement naming Tina Fuller who is an individual qualified and certified by the State Tax Commission as an Advanced Assessing Officer, to be the County Designated Assessor for Mackinac County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City Manager is hereby authorized to effectuate the necessary documents to implement this agreement.

Resolution Establishing Authorized Signatories for MERS Contracts and Service Credit Purchase Approvals

This Resolution is entered into under the provisions of 1996 PA 220 and the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan ("MERS") Plan Document, as each may be amended.

This resolution is being adopted by the governing body of the participating entity and applies to all reporting units of said participating entity.

WHEREAS, City of St. Ignace ("Employer") is a participating municipality with the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan ("MERS") and has adopted one or more retirement, insurance, investment or other post-employment benefit products administered by MERS;

WHEREAS, MERS requires signatures of an authorized representative of the Employer to execute contracts with MERS, the entry of which is authorized by the governing body and permitted under the applicable MERS Plan Document(s);

WHEREAS, the Employer wishes to designate certain job position(s), the holder(s) of which may sign MERS' contracts relating to the adoption, amendment and termination of MERS' products, and defined benefit service credit purchase approvals on behalf of Employer to implement decisions and actions of the governing body;

WHEREAS, this Resolution is not intended to apply to MERS forms or any other MERS document except as specifically mentioned herein,

Therefore, the Governing Body resolves:

The holders of the following job position(s) are hereby *Authorized Officials* that can sign: (1) MERS Adoption Agreements, Resolutions, Participation Agreements, Administrative Services Agreements, Withdrawal Agreements and any other contracts between MERS and the Employer with respect to Employer's participation in any MERS-administered product and any amendments and addendums thereto, and (2) MERS Defined Benefit service credit purchase approvals:

1. City Manager
2. City Clerk
3. City Treasurer

This Resolution may be revoked in writing or amended by the Governing Body at any time, provided that it will not be effective until such writing or amended Resolution is received by MERS. The Governing Body agrees that MERS may rely upon this Resolution as conferring signing authority upon the holders of the above job position(s) to bind Employer with respect to MERS.

City Manager Long presented a Telecommuting Policy to Council that was recommended by the Policy Committee after their meeting today at 5:30 p.m. The Policy defines a work-from-home process upon approval by the direct Supervisor and the City Manager when emergency situations arise requiring work outside of the office. Also required is a time sheet to log hours worked and a description of tasks, signed and dated by the employee.

WHEREAS, the residents of the City of St. Ignace would like to provide a safe community for pedestrian; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Ignace requests that the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) to convert highway BL I-75 from 4 travel lanes to 2 travel lanes with a center lane for left turns (3 lanes) from Antoine Street to North Airport and High Street to Church Street; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes would be included with current construction projects; and

WHEREAS, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of St. Ignace City Council does support and is formally requesting that MDOT convert the 4-lane BL I-75 to a 3-lane cross section at or near Antoine Street to North Airport and High Street to Church Street.

Dear Mayor Litzner and Council Members,

The St. Ignace Planning Commission met to discuss traffic flow in the city and an MDOT proposal to narrow the BL-75 roadway from 4 lanes to 3 in two places in the city. The Commission did not support the narrowing between High and Church Streets at the South End of Town, due to our concern about the hill and curve of the street causing limited visibility to drivers and those making turns into driveways and side streets. The Commission did support the narrowing from 4 lanes to 3 between Antoine St. and North Airport Road.

The Commission further discussed a more significant concern about traffic flow at both ends of the City, and determined that narrowing the roadway to 3 lanes without concurrent reduction in the speed limit is creating a difficult and frustrating problem for drivers in the City. The Planning Commission is aware that lane reduction by MDOT is not accompanied by discussions of changes in speed limit. The Commission therefore recommends, in the best interest of the community, that Council begin a separate process of reducing the speed limit to 25 mph between Church Street and Grondin Road, inclusive.

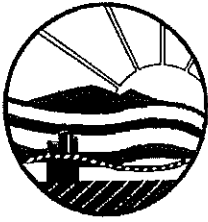
